Additional comments:

If your organic waste is making up 50% of your Red Bin waste, is it not time to consider whether the introduction of a Green Bin is warranted? Our communities are changing significantly from when most houses had a compost area in their section. With the changes to how our dwellings are inhabited ie visitor accommodation and holiday homes, I don't believe that education for minimising organic waste may make a huge difference to the amount of organics being put in the Red Bins. A lot of our non permanent Ratepayers live in urban areas and have a Green Bin for disposing of their Garden and Food Waste, so I think if they don't minimise waste at their permanent residences, they certainly won't be minimising waste at their holiday homes.

Other councils pay for Batteries dropped off at recovery parks, are our Ratepayers getting the best deal here, where they do not get paid and have been charged in the past for this service.
