Visitors and residents in Tekapo will now have another opportunity to take a break, and look at the view. A new facility, including toilets, has been completed at the junction of Hamilton Drive and the Fairlie-Tekapo Road on the eastern side of town.

As well as toilets, the new Hamilton Drive site has a number of amenities including picnic tables, bike stands and shelter, Campervan waste disposal unit and a trash compactor. The new facility is also near the Tekapo start of the popular Alps 2 Ocean Trail.

The new toilets are pay operated with payWave at \$1.50 and the option of coin payment at \$2.00 will be available soon.

The facility was opened on Wednesday 23 July by Acting Mayor Karen Morgan, Chair

of the Tekapo Community Board Steve Howes, and Councillor for Tekapo Matt Murphy.

This toilets, bike shelter and picnic tables were funded from council's capital work programme. We're grateful to the team at Dimension Building and pleased to report that the project came in on budget.



As part of a district-wide project, Rooney Earthmoving Limited (REL) has been awarded the contract to install smart water meters in Tekapo township.

Drinking-quality treated water is expensive to produce, and it is important that we do not let it leak out of pipes or valves and go to waste. By installing meters at the point of consumption we can identify the places where we are losing water and we can target our repair work to address these issues.

The meters also let us know where a property has a potential leak so that we can alert the homeowner that there may be a problem. This could mean we can help prevent unexpected large bills from undetected leaks. This can be particularly useful for absent or holiday homeowners.



When will this happen?

The work involves the installation of a meter and toby box to every water connection in Tekapo, starting on 4 August. Contractors will be starting in the following streets:

- Lochinver Avenue
- Mistake Drive
- Rapuwai Lane

- Manning Place
- Motuariki Lane

The project is planned to be completed by the end of October.

How will the meters work?

The meter will log the flow of water passing through it, and will send that information via the mobile data network to Council's systems in the office every day.


Does this mean that water will cost more?

There is no intention to change the amount we charge for water. Currently, the first 500m3 are included in your water rate. Anything over 500m3 currently incurs a charge, and this extra will continue to be billed.
