We oppose in totality the application by Queenstown Commercial Parapenters Limited for the establishment of a commercial tree rope climb course within the existing pine trees at the Tekapo lakefront.

The reasons for my submission (the reasons I support or oppose the particular parts of the application above):  The reasons for our opposition to the application are as follows  1) The land is currently zoned Passive Recreation (P) under the Operative District Plan and we believe Open Space under Plan Change 29. The purpose of the zoning is to maintain informal and FREE activities such as picnics, walking and children playing along the lakeside. 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## Continuation of the reasons we oppose the submission

The submission proposes annexing more than 8000 sq m of lakefront land zoned P and although nothing is to be" fenced off "as far as we understand it is unlikely people will be wanting to undertake passive recreation activities such as picnics or children playing under people suspended on wires and platforms 3-10m above the ground. This will have the effect of substantially reducing the amount of usable passive recreation space. There is no plan we can see to mitigate against this in the submission. Open space needs to be protected.

2) The effect on aesthetics and landscape we feel has been understated in the submission. Lake Tekapo is an area of outstanding natural beauty, and the addition of artificial structures will detract from this. We refer to the peer review Landscape Assessment from Bron Faulkner from May of this year commissioned by MDC. Not all essential methodology was employed in assessing the effects from the development. Specifically, that the pine trees to be used are a significant source of shade in summer and for reasons stated earlier people are going to be reluctant to seek shelter from the sun under the ropes and zip lines.

There is no acknowledgement in the submission about the operational effects of the development. Presumably some of the proposed 6 staff on site from 9am to 7pm 365 days per year will be shouting instructions and encouragement to the participants and this will generate a sense of increased busyness for want of a better word further detracting from the intended passive recreation zoning of the area. We note also Bron Faulkner's opinion that the proposed development is inappropriate for the location. There is no definitive conclusion about the visual effect from Station Bay. We note in the application a photograph taken **without our permission** from Lot 9 which most definitely shows a negative visual effect.

- 3) We feel that there has been insufficient consideration given to the effect of traffic with the proposed development. It is unrealistic to surmise that a significant proportion of participants are going to arrive by foot or bicycle from the township. There is no evidence in the submission to support this. Parking is already at a premium in the peak summer months, and we refer to a letter from Kirstin Royce Consultant Planner MDC dated 25 January 2024. This will further lead to strain on the area's infrastructure.
- **4)** Other issues include the ongoing problem of wilding pines and the possibility that the development will delay or prevent the removal of an ongoing seedling source. Arowhenua have raised this as a legitimate concern and the reason they are unable to agree with the development. Genesis Energy have also raised some concerns about potential flooding if operating at near maximum control level (appendix 6).
