AF8 Earthquake Information Evening at Twizel - Wednesday 14 May

An information evening is taking place at Twizel Events Centre on Wednesday 14 May from 7:00pm for Alpine Fault magnitude 8 (AF8) earthquake preparedness and response.

The information evening is a joint venture between seismologists, Civil Defence, and Ngāi Tahu iwi, and is supported by Mackenzie District Council.

While we can't predict when earthquakes will occur, scientific research has shown that the Alpine Fault has a history of generating regular, large earthquakes.

The next event is likely to occur within the lifetime of most of us, or our children and young people, for whom this is likely to have major short and long-term impacts.

Fairlie Village Green playground gets a make-over

The Village Green playground in Fairlie is getting a bit of a make over or tidy up.

When Council demolished the old toilets we asked the community for their ideas and wishes for the site. The majority of people who responded said they wanted to see the playground fenced along the state highway to help keep the children safe.

Work will now start on the 28th April to install a fence along the Talbot Street and Main Road (state highway) sides of the playground. The fence will have gates to allow access and the Village Green side will remain open to allow direct access from the rest of the park. Emergency services and contractor vehicles will also be able to access the area when necessary.

The fence will be a 1.2m high 'pool type' fence allowing visibility while keeping our little people safe. The other improvement you'll see happening is the installation of shade sails over the playground. The posts are installed and the sails will be made and installed for the next summer. The community has raised funds for this work and our thanks go to all who have contributed, including the following groups and contractors:

In addition, should funds allow, future development on the site of the old toilets may include seating or a BBQ.
