

Jack Lovelock Track and Nixons Road fords

Work is taking place over May by Fulton Hogan and contractors on building a concrete 'wash-over' ford on Jack Lovelock Track, near Fairlie.

This road is well used by pedestrians, cyclists, and four-wheel drive vehicles, although becomes impassable when the ford is flooded, often requiring remedial work before being passable again.

The current contour of the existing ford limits the vehicles that are able to cross it when dry.

While this work is taking place, a bridge on Nixons Road, at the end of its working life, will be replaced by a 'wash-over' ford.

Earthworks for both fords will be done by High Country Earthworks, while Lakes Construction will do boxing and concrete work.

Jack Lovelock Track is named after New Zealand athlete Jack Lovelock (1910-1949). Jack grew up in Fairlie between 1919 and 1923, and was Dux at Fairlie Primary School. He went on to achieve New Zealand's first gold medal for athletics at the 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin, Germany.

Do you need support for a community project?

The three community boards in the Mackenzie District have grant funding available to encourage and support not-for-profit organisations with a positive impact on the community. They can help local organisations pay for specific projects, events, or the maintenance of facilities that benefit the community.

It is preferable that the organisations applying for these grants are incorporated societies or trusts, but informal organisations and individuals may also apply.

How much are the grants?

Most grants are for less than \$500, although occasionally larger grants are approved.
