Background: I first visited Burkes Pass in 1983 when I was teaching design at the University of Canterbury. Over the next seventeen years my wife and I continued to visit New Zealand and Burkes Pass on a regular basis. In 1999 we purchased the Burkes Pass school and added living space to the rear of the building while maintaining the historic portion of the school. For the last twenty five years we have continued to use the school as our home in New Zealand.

I believe that Burkes Pass provides a unique visual connection between the past history of the region and natural majesty of the Mackenzie basin. It is an essential element in the fabric of the kiwi experience that is both unique and unforgettable.

The specific provisions of the proposal that my submission relates to are as follow: The recommendations by Richard Knott in his assessment 4 July 2024.

- *Te Kopi-o-Ōpihi / Burkes Pass Heritage Overlay*

I support the Te Kopi-o-Ōpihi / Burkes Pass Heritage Overlay as recommended by heritage expert Richard Knott in his assessment 4 July 2024. A heritage expert developed this overlay after inspection of the site, direct consultation of those involved and access to previous work of spatial planning.

I support the inclusion of all the heritage items recommended by Richard Knott.

The reason(s) for my submission are: The extensive report based on accepted NZ heritage methodology states: “Overall the area has high heritage significance and contributes to an understanding and appreciation of the history and cultures of the district and the district’s identity and should be added to the schedule of heritage places within the Mackenzie District Plan.”

I support for the Te Kopi-o-Ōpihi / Burkes Pass Heritage Overlay as recommended by heritage expert Richard Knott in his assessment 4 July 2024 is because: the overlay as proposed in this version provides a visual continuity between the heritage sites as well as providing an open space for resting, walking and parking.

3. I support for the inclusion of all the heritage items recommended by Richard Knott especially the schoolteachers house, Burkes Pass Accommodation house (former Paddy’s Market homestead) Elm Tree cottage and Highfield cottage is because: these few remaining
