Wallaby culling at Tekapo

A recent wallaby shoot behind Tekapo township by was a success, with contractors shooting 46 wallabies in total.

While this has caused a dent in the wallaby population in this area, it is a cause for concern how far the wallaby population is moving towards the west.

Wallabies are an introduced pest in the New Zealand, and due to their appetite for grazing on pasture and plants, they are destroying our native biodiversity and productive lands.
