Rural road safety improvements



Glen Lyon Road ford

Lakes Construction, assisted by Neil Sproull Earthmoving have recently installed a guard rail on the downstream side of the Glen Lyon Road ford near Twizel.

This safety improvement is aimed to prevent vehicles from being washed downstream when trying to cross in times of floods. Permanently mounted signage has also been put into place to warn if the ford is closed. A further safety improvement for this ford will be the installation of ford depth markers.

Haldon Road flood recovery works

Flood Recovery works by Council's roading contractor, Fulton Hogan, on Haldon Road are nearing completion. Drainage works are already proving their worth with the recent rainfall keeping the water flowing and off the road.



Fairlie Stormwater upgrade work

Over June and July Council's contractors are replacing stormwater pipes from Denmark Street to Ayr Street in Fairlie. From Ayr Street there will also be the installation of a short section to the helipad entrance.

The work in expected to take approximately 10 weeks. The work will see the installation of 450mm and 375mm PVC pipe. Our contractors will be in touch with affected residents, and will take into account if there are any short-term impacts on access to properties.

Mayor Anne, Mayors Taskforce for Jobs, and Ministry of Social Development wish Justin well with his apprenticeship.










Icy roads in winter
