The reason(s) for my submission are:

- * Our subject land currently sits within the Mackenzie Basin Subzone. Once Plan Change 23 is approved we will not be able to do anything with this land. We request it be removed from the ONL and Mackenzie Basin Subzone so that in the future it may be subdivided and subsequently developed. Its proximity to Twizel would dictate this to be the optimal use.
- * The surrounding land to the north has been subdivided/developed. Land to the east is proposed to be zoned Rural Lifestyle. To the south is Lake Ruataniwha and to the west is the Ohau A Powerstation and Pukaki Canal. There is built form in every direction so why is this land still classed as an ONL? Why does it still sit within the Subzone?
- * Marisha Terrace and the Ohau River Block have their own zones, soon to be Rural Lifestyle zones with respective overlays. Our subject land


I seek the following decision from the Mackenzie District Council: will be marooned.
