I am the chairman of Disc Golf Wanaka Incorporated. We are an incorporated society with charitable purposes based in Wanaka. We have had the pleasure of running the Moonbase Twizel New Zealand Disc Golf Tour Event in conjunction with Disc Golf Twizel on the Twizel Greenbelt Disc Golf Course for the last eight years. The last two years have seen the numbers attending this much loved three day event jump to over 100 and player numbers will no doubt continue to increase in years to come. Rezoning the land between Ruataniwha Road and Dobson place as Commercial Visitor Accommodation Precinct would lead to the loss of three iconic holes on the Twizel Disc Golf Course effectively leading to the closure of the Course. This would subsequently jeopardise the running of this long standing NZ tour event and the subsequent economic impact. The removal of this valuable green space and recreational pursuit for locals, domestic and international visitors alike would certainly reduce the well documented submission health benefits of this free to use public amenity. Disc Golf is a fast growing and low cost recreational activity for all the family from 6 to 86 year olds. According to the Udisc scoring app, at least 3000 rounds were played on the Twizel Greenbelt Disc Golf Course in 2020 and over 4600 in 2021. These numbers are likely to be at least four times higher due to most casual players not using the app. The rounds played on the Twizel Greenbelt course are set to continue their increase in years to come as the game of disc golf continues to grow in popularity in NZ and worldwide. Finally, encroachment of commercial projects onto cherished greenbelt land would create an unacceptable precedent into the future. I implore the council to reconsider this proposed rezoning and amend Change 2 I to leave the area between Ruataniwha Road and Dobson Place as a no-build area to protect this valuable recreational and health giving resource.
