Council and the Tekapo Community Board are pleased to share details of forthcoming improvements to the Takapō lakefront.

The Takapō/Tekapo Lakefront Minor Improvements Project will deliver on the community's desire to improve the public space along the Takapō lakefront. The addition of well-connected high-quality paths and other landscaping improvements will make this high-profile area more attractive and accessible for locals and visitors.

The project will create a continuous pathway connection from Tekapo Springs in the West, along the main reserve waterfront to the pedestrian bridge to the Church of the Good Shepherd. It will also improve the reserve area between the main playground by the Four Square and the main car park.

The work will continue on from the Lake Front/Town Centre improvements, begun with the expanded car park, new toilets and playground installation that has taken place over the last decade.

It is recognizing the area between the highway and the lake edge needed to cater better for the high number of visitors the town receives, would support economic growth and create a desirable community space for residents.

Project details have been agreed with the Tekapo Community Board. Staff are working with lake level data to ensure the path will not be impacted by high lake levels. The contract is being finalized, and we expect work will be underway from June. Concrete will be laid in spring, with completion of the work scheduled for mid-November 2022.

Rabbit Control at Lake Alexandrina

Contractors have commenced rabbit control at the Lake Alexandrina Huts, Tekapo, on behalf of Mackenzie District Council, from Wednesday 25 May. Hutt holders (presidents), Environment Canterbury and adjacent landowners at Balmoral station have been contacted, and signs have been placed at all the entries to the Hut areas. Pindone is distributed via carrots which are dyed green and are toxic to people and animals. Poison bait and carcasses are deadly to dogs.

Everyone is asked to take care if in the impacted area. The combination of activity in the Glenmore, Balmoral and the Alexandrina Hut areas means we have a real chance of seriously impacting rabbit numbers in the area. After Dark Road Safety Audit

A night time road safety audit took place by Council's roading contractor Fulton Hogan during May. The audit, lead by Fulton Hogan's Network & Safety Manager Robyn Gardener, involved a network drive of Mackenzie District roads after dark.

Along with support from Andrew 'Dusty' Rhodes, and direction from Mackenzie District Council Roading Manager Scott McKenzie, the purpose of the audit is to get an appreciation for what road users experience during the hours of darkness, checking that items such as signage and road markings are clear, in good condition and provide the clear messages for the road users across the district.



The audit will further provide focus on key network routes, focus on known 'high risk' spots but also provide opportunity to identify areas or locations that could do with more devices to help road users getting difficulty or more importantly saving lives.
